BEST AMONG THE REST

DISCLAIMER: Please recognize that I am not a Medical Doctor. I have been an avid student researching and studying prostate cancer as a survivor and continuing patient since 1992. I have dedicated my retirement years to continued research and study in order to serve as an advocate for prostate cancer awareness, and, from a activist patient's viewpoint, to voluntarily help patients, caregivers, and others interested develop an understanding of prostate cancer, its treatment options, and the treatment of the side effects that often accompany treatment. There is absolutely no charge for my mentoring – I provide this free service as one who has been there and hoping to make your journey one with better understanding and knowledge than was available to me when I was diagnosed so many years ago. Readers of this paper must understand that the comments or recommendations I make are not intended to be the procedure to blindly follow; rather, they are to be reviewed as my opinion, then used for further personal research, study, and subsequent discussion with the medical professional/physician providing your prostate cancer care.

I have often been asked how I determine "my personal opinion" "Best Among the Rest" physicians:

I have been deeply involved in research and study of prostate cancer since 1996 when I experienced my cancer recurrence. At the same time I have been monitoring and responding to posts on the various prostate cancer support lists. And, I have been attending annual conferences on prostate cancer where I had the opportunity to meet and listen to presentations made at those conferences by physicians that were selected for those presentations based on their well known expertise in research and treatment of our insidious disease.

During these several years we regularly see the recommendation to patients, particularly newly diagnosed or those with recurring disease, to seek out

physicians with known expertise in whichever treatment option the patient may be interested (surgery, radiation, cryosurgery, androgen deprivation, chemotherapy, Active Surveillance, erectile dysfunction, incontinence, and-you-name-it). And, it became obvious that little was known by most posting on the several support lists as to just who are those physicians with such expertise. With that recognition, I began assembling "my" personal opinion list of physicians I had found could be considered "Best Among the Rest" as regards prostate cancer that I could then pass on to those interested. I included physicians who had been invited because of their expertise to provide presentations at these annual national conferences, physicians who their colleagues recommended, and physicians whom I had learned from at least three or more patients as having provided excellent administration of treatment procedures, and with no reasonable adverse reports. I then looked up these physicians to learn of papers they may have written and to have an idea of how long they had been in practice.

Most certainly there are likely many others that I have not yet met, heard, or been recommended by either colleagues or at least three patients.

ROBOTIC LAPAROSCOPIC RADICAL PROSTATECTOMY

COMMENTS by a patient administered RaLRP by Dr. Samadi: "Four days after my robotic surgery, I feel as good as I did before the surgery, except for the catheter - which is a nuisance. The catheter comes out tomorrow. I've felt good all along. I've still had absolutely no pain - from the moment I came out of anesthesia to now. Dr. Samadi gave me prescriptions for pain and for bladder spasms, just in case. I haven't needed either. I wonder if I'm just very lucky, or, if my case is typical after robotic surgery by a competent Dr. like Samadi." Dr. Samadi was featured on an NBC News "Today" show November 7, 2013 as part of the Movember movement with both Matt Lauer and Al Roker providing blood samples for PSA level check as well as receiving the DRE (digital rectal examination) to evaluate if there were hardness or nodules noticed on the prostate gland. Matt Lauer recently had a PSA test with a result of less than 1.0ng/ml and the DRE was absent of any abnormalities. Al Roker's PSA to still be determined and DRE only found the presence of an enlarged prostate (no other abnormalities) and he and Dr. Samadi will continue future appointments to keep an eye on any changes; in any case, avoiding biopsy until diagnostics indicate that necessity. ANDROGEN DEPRIVATION THERAPY (ADT)

From my personal experience as well as research and study regarding androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) prescribing an LHRH agonist (Lupron, Eligard, Trelstar, Zoladex) or antagonist (Firmagon/degarelix); an antiandrogen (bicalutamide/Casodex, flutamide/Eulexin, or nilutamide/Nilandron; and a 5Alpha Reductase (5AR) inhibitor (dutasteride/Avodart or finasteride/Proscar) when required for recurring disease or advanced prostate cancer when ADT becomes the required therapy, see http://tinyurl.com/74bkzam.

I have been on this treatment for more than ten years. I like the fact that I don't have to worry about osteoporosis. I don't have hot flashes. I have better quality sleep than I ever had during the years I was on Lupron. Furthermore I retain some libido and the ability to have orgasms. Lastly, according to several studies, estradiol may be cognitively protective.

As a scientist though, I was not completely happy with N=1 data. Also I needed to convince myself that my positive reaction to estradiol for ADT wasn't simply a placebo effect. It took me close to a decade to get the funding for the basic research needed to confirm several of the benefits of estradiol for ADT. With the $25 \mid P$ a g e 25

help of my graduate student Erik Wibowo, we have now established in a rat model the estradiol in androgen-deprived males improves sleep quality and indeed reduces daytime fatigue. Although we didn't test it, better sleep reduces the risk of cognitive impairment. We also have circumstantial evidence to support the idea that estrogens can help raise libido above castrate levels. I personally favor the gel product EstroGel, over any of the patches as it is easier to manage. I have used both and have found that titrating the dose is easier with the gel than the patches."

It should be acknowledged, though, that estrogen treatment (including transdermal estradiol) may not be advisable for patients with a family history of estrogen sensitive breast cancer nor a personal history of deep vein thrombosis or pulmonary emboli. It is also contraindicated in patients whose prostate cancer is androgen independent (i.e., castrate resistant). Finally a case against transdermal estradiol for ADT is that it reduces the financial reward to the pharmaceutical and medical industry, since androgen suppression achieved with transdermal estradiol is generally much cheaper than with LHRH drugs. This may not be a concern for patients, but it might be for their physicians. In any case, I am not an MD and patients should only go on estradiol with MD supervision.

I encourage other patients to talk over the transdermal estradiol option with their MD. Physicians are welcome to contact me for more information.

PATHOLOGY:

Importance of Expert Pathology Opinion:

Despite the fact that the Gleason score might NOT change after an expert review, the reality is that more often it does. However, the issue is who did the first review. There are talented pathologists who are focused on prostate cancer and also two national labs who are focused on PC as well.

The Gleason score is a critical item; it is used as a variable in virtually every prognostic and treatment algorithm. An accurate GS mandates an expert pathology opinion from a PC pathology expert. The ones that I am most familiar with include:

A second opinion on the microscopic pathology is usually covered by insurance but if not, runs about \$500 pending on what is done. A copy of the original pathology report with the actual slides or recuts from the tissue block are sent to the outside reviewer. Your primary care doctor or you can initiate such a 2nd opinion but you need to request this and ask for a specific physician or lab to be used.

People have questioned why some physician specialists have moved from health insurance acceptance to fee-forservice – let me explain - health insurers no longer compensate for the amount of personal time in which these physician specialists provide direct and comprehensive attention to their patients, so these specialists have had to resort to fee-for-service; don't be surprised if we see many more physician specialists moving to fee-for-service in view of limitations being considered in health insurance coverage. Dr. Strum's reasonable fee is \$400.00 per hour and after the initial two hour consultation, accumulation of the patient's entire health history, and development of a comprehensive strategy of treatment, he provides actual time in minutes spent each time he updates the patient's SMF so the patient is aware of billing charges. Consider that a usual appointment with a Medical Oncologist (and more often than not, one who does not "specialize specifically in prostate cancer") with the appointment usually lasting no more than 15 minutes with billing around likely more than \$125.00 for that 15 minutes, the cost for most any "generalist" Medical Oncologist could actually add up to around \$500.00 if provided an hour of specific attention, though you are unlikely to get such attention. The cost of Dr. Strum's fee-for-service is better described in an exchange between the famous artist "Whistler" who was once asked by John Ruskin: "For two days labour, you ask two hundred guineas?" 18F-FLUORIDE PET/CT SCAN

A bone scan with technetium 99 is not likely to show pathology at low level PSA, whereas 18F-Fluoride PET/CT has this capability. PET scanning in general (including FDG PET) and 18F-Fluoride PET are not to be confused with 18F-Fluoride PET/CT. The latter is the technique recommended for acquiring images and combining images to identify early developing bone metastases as well as scanning lymph nodes, and is available at only a few locations. Below are a few of which I am aware. This was info from a few years back, so likely many other facilities now have 18F-Fluoride PET/CT capability.

<u>SPECIAL NOTE:</u> The last I was aware, Medicare does NOT yet approve the 18F-Fluoride PET/CT bone scan, therefore other insurers may follow suit. This may have changed, but patients should check to make sure.
